

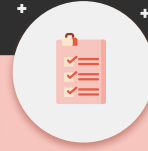

Fostering Communication

- **Discussions:** Students share their opinions with the whole class (students names are anonymous - can be toggled off)
- **Create a Collaborate!** *parking lot* for questions and comments during a presentation or lesson. Students can post throughout the lesson.
- **Have students create** and share success criteria for assignments or tasks.
- **Create a thank you, greeting, or honor board** to share with another class or with a specific person or group.
- **Exit Ticket:** Before class ends, allow students to share what they learned--great for new grammar points, etc - Example: "Make a sentence using a gerund as the subject"

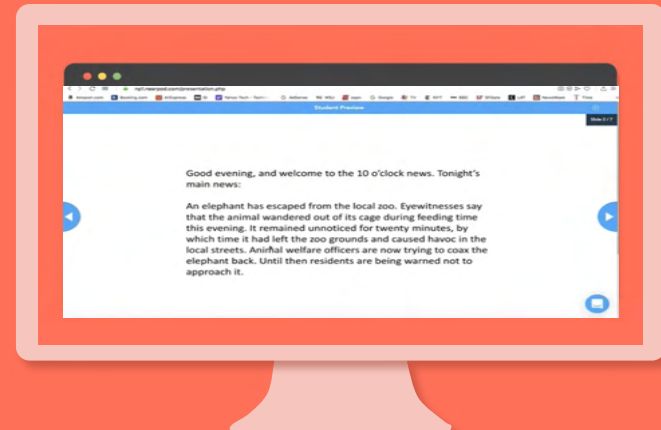

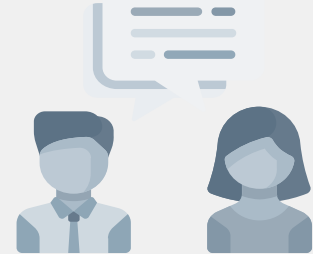

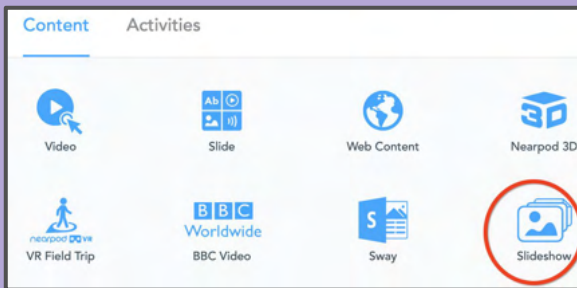

Adding slides

Add PPT slides directly into your nearpod. This is great for scaffolding multiple speaking practice topics without requiring students to return to the mainroom (if you are teaching online) to change topics.

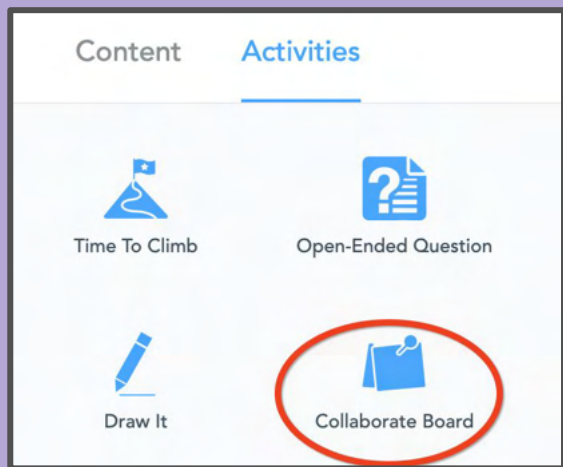

A daily diary! Create a stand alone wall and choose a couple of students to be "scribes" of the day. Share the day's activities.



2 ♥

How's your memory? Ask students what they remember from the previous day's lesson. You will know quickly what still needs to be taught and this will also serve as a good place for students to review content.



2 ♥

Book Wishlist (or any wishlist)- Have your students add some books they might like to read on a wishlist board. Your school librarian will love you if you share this!

Use Collaborate! to gather feedback! Evaluate a lesson. As the questions: "What would you do differently? What did you enjoy?"

Student Voice! Post and tell opinions and ideas!

Post before you go! Use it for exit tickets.

Students can share a strategy used to solve a problem then compare strategies to demonstrate more than one right answer

Create an honor board on Veterans Day, Mother's Day or Father's Day with honor posts. Then share.

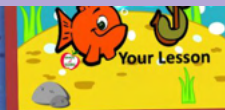
Create a class space for Snow Days. Let students post throughout the day what they did during the snow day.



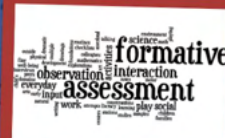
Real time question bank - Let your students ask questions during the lesson when they don't understand something or need a better explanation. Review the questions at the end of the lesson.



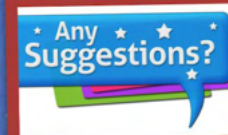
Studying current events: Have students post recent news articles relevant to their learning.



Formative Assessment- Ask questions like: What were the main points we covered today? Write down three things you learned today.



Suggestion box: Ask for suggestions or ideas — Let students share ideas for improving. You'll definitely want to moderate these answers!



Open House or Meet the Teacher Night - Leave a tablet or computer at the exit point, so parents could add a post on your board. Ask for some innovative new ideas that would make the school a better place. (Definitely moderate this one!)



Prior Knowledge - What do students already know about the topic you're about to teach. Students just post their knowledge on Collaborate!, so you can see how to build your lesson. This is a great stand-alone or bell ringer activity too!



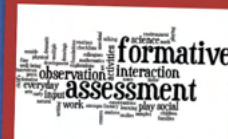
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Happy Birthday Board! When it's a student's birthday, students write some NICE birthday wishes to the student. (PLEASE moderate this one! Cyber bullies are out there!)



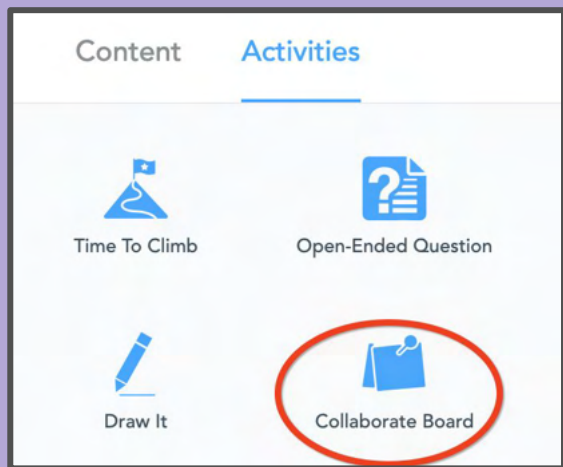

Formative Assessments are quick and easy. Post a question and get immediate feedback without leaving the page.





Using the Collaboration Board



Collaborate together

- **Create a Think-Pair-Share board.** Set a timer. Think, ding. Discuss, ding. Then POST! This is great for starting out a new unit or new topic.
- **Give students choices and a chance to vote.** Ask a question then solicit a response. Have students vote on their preference. Sort by “likes” and you have your answer!
- **Create a board in response to peer presentations** (might want to approve these first!). Create a Collaborate! slide for each presentation and have students provide peer review during and after the presentations.

Peer Reviews - Add a note in response to peer presentations (might want to approve these first!) Create a collaborate slide for each presentation and have students provide peer review.

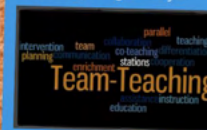

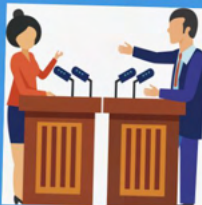

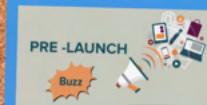

Using the Collaboration Board to foster collaboration continued...

Start a story and let students take from there. Create a scenario, and ask your students what happens next - let them take turns one-by-one or in groups to post their own adventure. Sort by time of entry.

ONCE UPON A TIME



Book Discussions - When the complete class has to read the same book, it's fun to create a discussion and post about the characters, things people do in the book, hidden meanings, plot twists, etc. You can even let them invent a sequel to the book.

BOOK DISCUSSION
GROUPS



Let students add two 'tops' and one 'tip'. Tops are things to do or done well. Tips are advice or improvements. Use after a student presentation, for a character from history, or a cell in the body!

TOP TIPS



Collaborate in real time with another class in another city or country! Share your board topic and see what different perspectives are posted.

Collaborative Notes — While listening to a presentation/video, lecture, etc., students can work together to add notes to produce a resource they can refer to later. This also works with staff meetings!

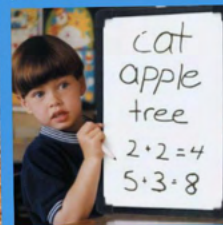


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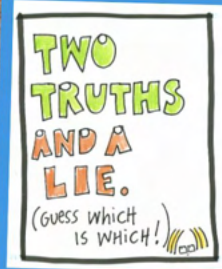
Event planning — If you're planning a class party or a field trip, have students or parents post a list of who's bringing what, links to pertinent websites and more.



Look at me! Students can write answers to questions or ideas on a small whiteboard. Then, using a camera on their devices, they can snap a picture of themselves holding the whiteboard (or sheet of paper) and post it.



Icebreaker - 2 Truths and a Lie: Let your students post a selfie and add 2 truths and 1 lie about themselves. It's up to the other students to find out which one is a lie. You'll be surprised by how well students can lie!

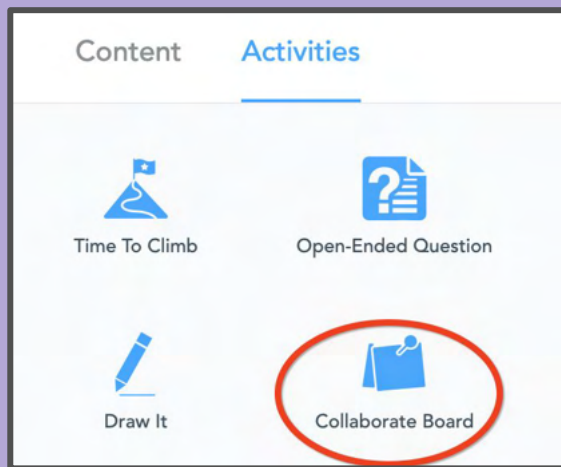


Get Inspired by Other Teachers! Share a board with your teacher colleagues and let them post crafty ideas for father's day, mother's day, valentine's day or just for the weekly craft class. You get ideas from other teachers & try out new things!

Using the Collaboration Board



Critical Thinking

- **What will happen?** Have students make predictions before reading a story, solving a problem, performing an experiment, etc.
- **What Would You Do?** Present a situation to the students and have them post on what they what they would do in the same situation.
- **Reflection** – Have students answer, “What do you think about,” or “Why is this the best way?” and provide support in their responses.
- **Paraphrasing - Say it differently** – Post a phrase as the title and students must repost the phrase, but in an entirely different way! This is great for allowing students to practice paraphrasing. Also, they can see all of their classmate responses! Vote on the best paraphrase to add some competition.
- **Ask the Expert** – Have students craft questions to ask a character from a story used in class or a person from the textbook. This is a great tool to use for GOAL lectures! The day before the goal lecture, have students brainstorm some questions they want to ask the presenter.

A third major change in **Italy's** food culture has been the rise of large restaurant chains. These chains are often foreign, and their numbers have increased **enormously** in recent years. This movement encourages people to eat healthy, locally sourced food. In **summary**, **globalization** has had a significant effect on the way that Italians eat. Its influence can be seen as both positive and negative. Convenience foods have replaced many of the **traditional** home-cooked meals, and the availability of foreign foods and international chains has **greatly** increased. Italians no longer have to rely on food that is produced locally. While some people welcome this extra choice, others fear the damage it may cause to Italian **traditions**, culture, and **local** businesses. On the other hand, the great

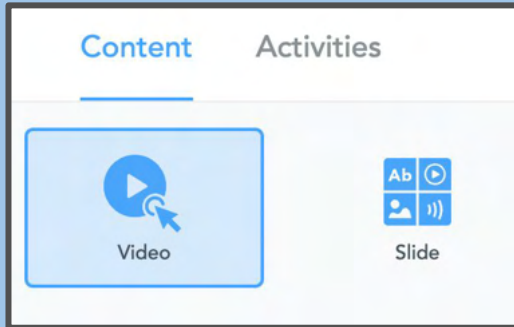
Answering questions from the textbook

Check the textbook questions with the quiz function. Put students into breakout rooms and have them work together to input their answers. From the teacher screen watch student progress and join their rooms if they need help.





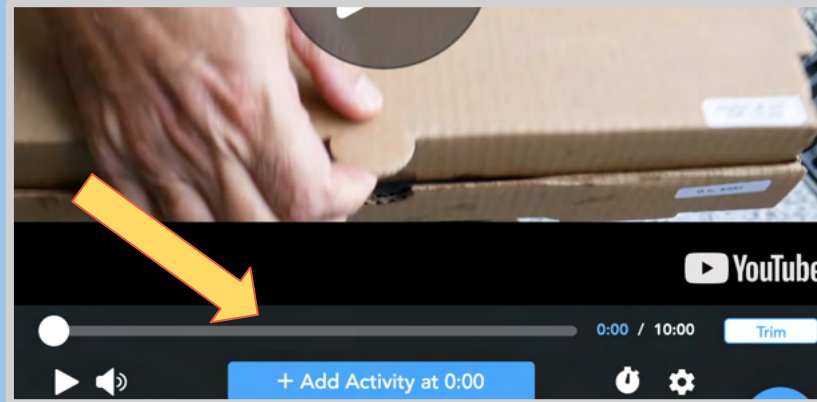
Make your lecture videos interactive using the interactive video function



Interactive Videos

In the physical classroom, we usually pause and ask questions at key moments during a video. With this Nearpod function, you can pre-determine these checks for understanding, even during asynchronous instruction, and every student has the opportunity to respond on their device. Upload a video of yourself teaching, upload the lecture from the textbook, or find a youtube video and add stop points to add questions to check for comprehension.

Other features: adjust playback speed or trim the video to make it shorter.

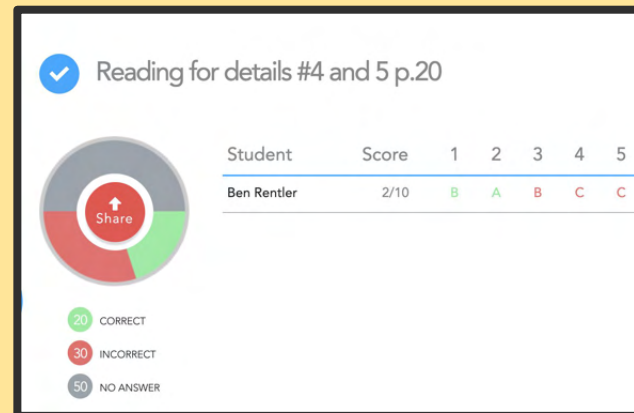
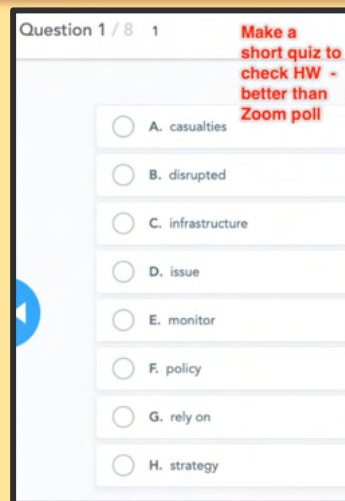


Check homework questions using the polls, quizzes, or time-to-climb game features



Checking Homework

1. Quickly and easily have students check their HW in pairs or groups through inputting hw questions and answers using the quiz function. After students submit answers, click on share results (red button) and check answers together as a class.
2. For a fun review game, convert your quiz into a time-to-climb game which is a competitive kahoot like activity with the whole class.
3. A poll can be used to quickly check an answer or get student feedback anonymously.





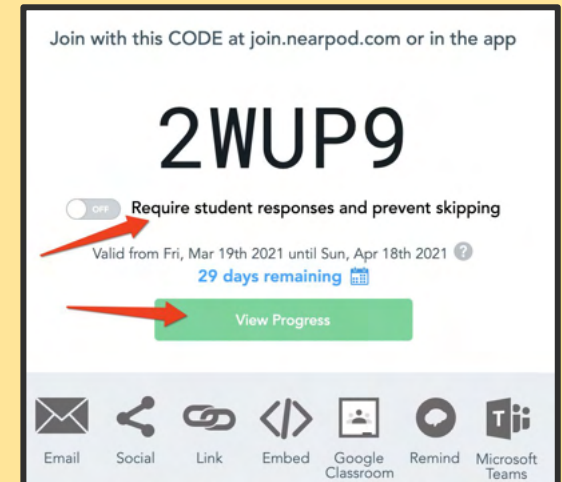
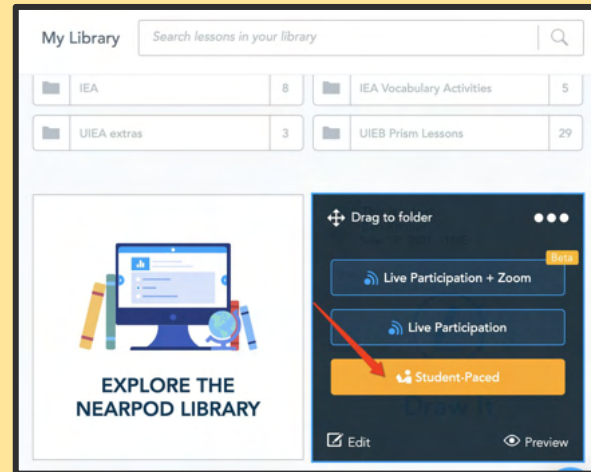
Assigning student-paced assignments on nearpod



Assigning HW using the student-paced feature

If students are about to enter a long break and you want them to do some work that you can monitor, try making a lesson into a student-paced assignment. This way, students can check their answers without requiring the teacher to hit the "share" button. Useful for using during class in breakout rooms for HW assignments with a lot of questions or when students are on a long break.

How to: When you go to your nearpod, click on launch student-paced lesson. To avoid students skipping, you can toggle that on. You can also check student progress.

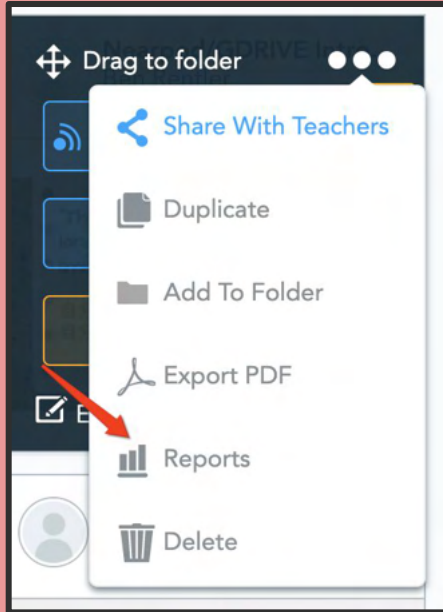

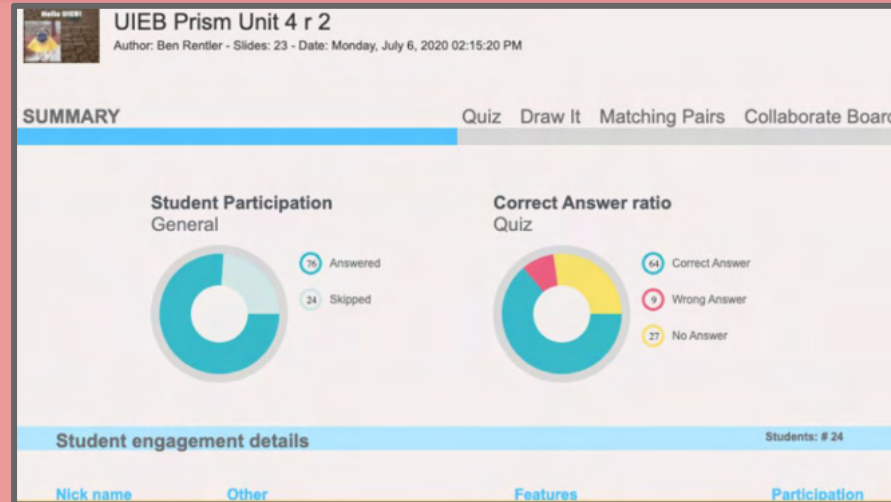
Informing future instruction with the engagement report feature



Download post-lesson engagement reports

Sometimes during an online lesson it is difficult to address every problem you see in the classroom. However, there is a nice feature on nearpod where you can download student participation in class. Use this to check for any issues in student understanding or your own teaching.

How to: From your nearpod homepage, click on the three dots, and then reports. A page will show all of student engagement details for each activity used in the lesson.



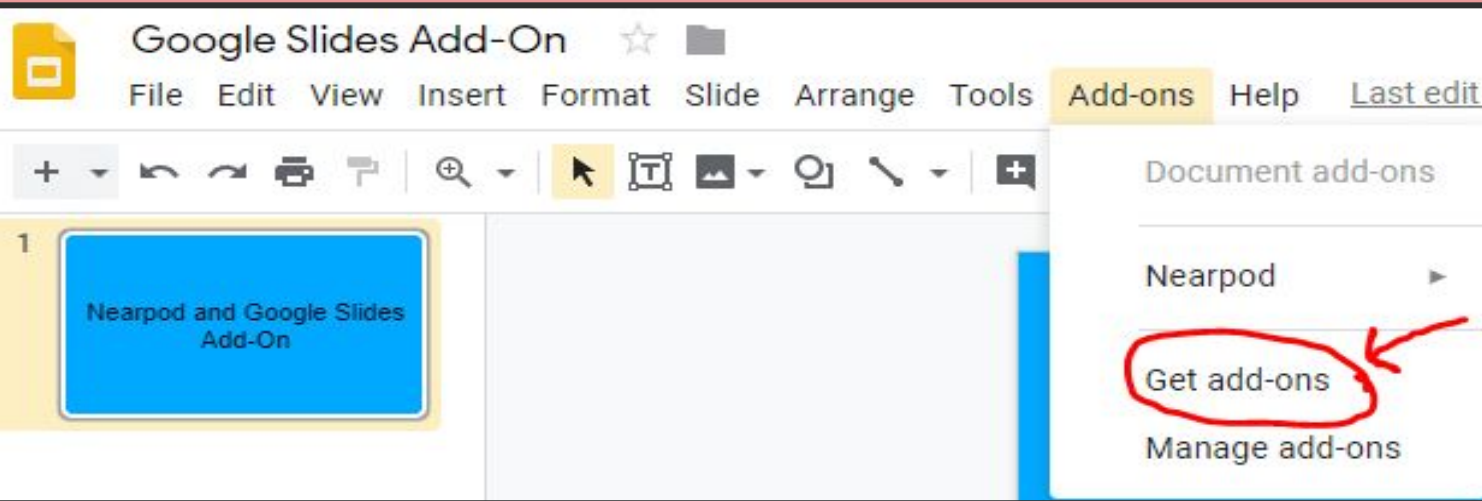


Connecting to Google Slides

Step 1: Download the Add-on from the Google Workspace Marketplace.

Step 2: Go to a Google Slides presentation from your drive.

Step 3: Click on Add-ons on the top menu bar, hover over Nearpod, and click "Open Nearpod" to use the add-on.
